



Code of Conduct

Any contestant or member will be disqualified from an NDHSRA rodeo, NHSRA event or rodeo, or any other associated function for any of the following offenses:

- Having any association with alcoholic beverages, narcotic, tobacco products or other non-medical drugs while in attendance at any approved High School or Junior High Rodeo or sanctioned activity, whether at a motel, on rodeo grounds, or going to or from the rodeo or at any NHSRA function. The member will be suspended from further rodeo activity for 6 weeks. If they are disqualified for any of these offenses, they will be disqualified from all events or other participation in the rodeo, NHSRA event or other function.
- Rowdiness, quarreling or fighting in the actual domain of the arena at any time, or any place during the duration of the Rodeo.
- Conduct or speech of any kind detrimental to the best interests of the NHSRA, NDHSRA or the sport of rodeo while in attendance, or coming to and going home from a rodeo.
- Motel or property damage by contestants or their associates; damage must be reported to the NDHSRA President and/or National Director. If damage is not reported, contestants will be banned from the High School Rodeo Association permanently and reported to law authorities for prosecution.
- Contestants will be disqualified for vandalism at any place or any time.
- Cheating or attempting to cheat.
- Any contestants or parents attempting to fix, threaten, bribe, influence, harass or coerce any rodeo official at any time.
- Missing any mandatory meeting, safety seminar or equipment check.
