



### **Draw Out:**

- When a contestant scratches their name from an entered rodeo prior to the Draw Out deadline the Monday before the rodeo at 5:00 pm CST.
- They will not be in the rodeo draw.
- They will not be in the rodeo program.
- No fines assessed.
- No points affected.

# Turn Out:

- When a contestant does not show up for their event/run.
- They are called 3X.
- Their animal will be released.
- Their run will be counted in the rake.
- Entry fees must be paid.
- A \$10 fine will be assessed in addition to entry fees and paid prior to the next rodeo.
- This does not affect points in any event.

# Notified Turn Out:

- When a contestant notifies the Secretary that they are unable to compete for whatever reason before the rodeo begins or their event occurs.
- Their name will be scratched from the official judges and timers' sheets.
- Their name will be in the rodeo program.
- Their run will be counted in the rake.
- When livestock is involved and the run has not been drawn an animal, they will not be counted in the draw.
- Fees must be paid.
- This does not affect points in any event.

# Medical Release Turn Outs:

- When a contestant notifies the Secretary that they are unable to compete due to an injury or illness before the rodeo begins or before their event occurs.
- If there is no doctor's note, turnout must be authorized by a judge or the National Director.
- A doctor's clearance note must be provided in order to compete again.
- Their name will be scratched from the official judges and timers' sheets.
- Their name will be in the rodeo program.

- Their run will be counted in the rake.
- When livestock is involved and the run has not been drawn an animal, they will not be counted in the draw unless the draw has already occurred. The animal will be turned out.
- Fees do not have to be paid.
- This does not affect points in any event.

### Vet Release Turn Outs:

- When a contestant notifies the Secretary before the rodeo begins or before their event occurs that their horse is injured.
- Secretary must be provided with a note from the veterinarian.
- A veterinarian note is not required to compete later.
- Their name will be scratched from the official judges and timers' sheets.
- Their name will be in the rodeo program.
- Their run will be counted in the rake.
- When livestock is involved and the run has not been drawn an animal, they will not be counted in the draw unless the draw has already occurred. The animal will be turned out.
- Fees do not have to be paid.
- This does not affect points in any event.
